## SNOWFLAKE - LOTTO Quilt Drawing Due January 11, 2024 at Guild Meeting



Make a 12.5 " Square. Snowflakes seem to be "white", but to see them in quilts, we need color, right? Use light colored backgrounds (white or cream preferred - solids or small prints). You decide the blue or winter-themed fabric! (Hope you will dig into the stash!) It is suggested the selvedges be removed and that the fabrics be pre-shrunk with starch/steam before cutting. Sew $1 / 4$ " or scant $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seams. Read directions then cut carefully.

You will be making 16 HST's (half-square triangles) $31 / 2$ " each. Use your favorite method, or use the instructions below.

Cut the following: 2 squares $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ of background \& 2 squares $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ of color (they will be trimmed.)
Sew as follows:

1. On the back of each $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background square, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner - both directions. Then draw two more lines across the middles of the square: side-to-side, then top-tobottom.
2. Lay each marked background square RST (right sides together) on top of each darker colored square. Pin in place.
3. Sew the first matched light/dark set $1 / 4$ " on each side of ONE diagonal line. STOP HERE and CUT on the DRAWN line, creating 2 half-square sections. (Don't start the next set yet; work on this one!)
4. Take one half-square section and sew $1 / 4$ " on each side of the "now" center (diagonal) line, then CUT on DRAWN line, creating two quarter-square sections. Notice that these quarter-squares each have a "now" diagonally drawn line, and that there are already sewn seams on the edges...So, CUT each quarter on the DRAWN lines. Repeat step 4 with the other half-square, making 8 half-triangle square units.
5. Repeat steps 3 \& 4 for the second set of light/dark matched squares, for 8 more half-triangle squares - to have 16 half-triangle squares total. Easy RIGHT!
6. Finally, square-up these 16 HTSs to $31 / 2$ " each. A "Triangle Square Up Ruler" works, if you have one, or just open and press seams under darker fabric, then square them to 3.5 " and trim "dogears" from corners.


Lay out your $31 / 2 "$ squares - according to picture. DOUBLE CHECK YOUR LAYOUT before sewing it's very easy to lay a piece wrong direction! Sew 4 squares per row and 4 rows. Press seams so that they nest with the next row. CHECK to be sure you sew the correct row edges together, too. Yes, stated from experience!!! Block is now complete.
