QUILTERS GUILD OF EAST TEXAS

The Quilters Guild of East Texas met at First Christian Church on Thursday, June 9, 2022. Sherry Gary, presented our Zoom speaker Suzi Parron. Suzi's lecture was about the history of barn quilts, the movement and where you might find barn quilt trails.

The Business meeting of the Guild was brought to order at 11:00 a.m. Sherry Gary, President, welcomed all members, and guests.

President – Sherry Gary - The May General Meeting minutes were approved as distributed in the newsletter.

Pat Graham moved that we have a Quilt Show for 2023. Jackie Ruffing seconded the Motion and the Motion carried.

Cecilia Brannon has volunteered to be the Quilt Show Chairman for the 2023 show.

1st Vice President – Corey Starkey – The Hive today will be a demonstration by Lisa Martin on prepared edge applique. Sue Olsson will demonstrate in July Steam Punk also called the Propellor Block. There is a pattern from Jan Kingswell. In August Rose Wilson will demonstrate the Cathedral Window technique. Supplies needed will be posted on the Website. September has not yet been decided.

The pillowcase project is going well. Beverly Lusk donated 20 today. Thank you, Beverly!

2nd Vice President – Sherry Gary for Cathy Woodson who was absent -The workshop tomorrow will be Rhonda Chapman showing us how to paint a barn quilt. Use an envelope opener to cut your chain piecing! Great ideas Sheryl, thank you for sharing.

July- Cuddle Quilt Challenge & Charities

We will all be showing the *Cuddle Quilts* we have made and members will vote for their favorite 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place for *prizes*. We will also have guests from some of our charities to talk about their work in the community and how they use our donations.

Workshop- Working with Wool Lisa Martin has created <u>2 different cute designs</u> for a mug rug or a pin cushion. She is providing the materials for a \$12 kit fee. Class is \$20. Supply list at QGETX.org Programs.

September- Trish Stuart

In September Trish will be talking to us about pushing boundaries by making simple changes or additions to inspire and energize our work. She will talk to us about her design work making collages, painting, and thread painting. We will have an inspiring showing of her quilts using different techniques.

Workshop- Grow a hummingbird Garden

The workshop is a collage in which participants will create a sky and streaming stems, flowers will be fussy cut, fused and stitched down. Next will be cutting out the hummingbird and learning how to layer to get the depth and movement. The hummingbird will then be stitched to the sky area. Your kit will include all the materials needed for the project such as top fabrics, batting, backing, fusible web and pattern instructions. The kit fee is \$38.
