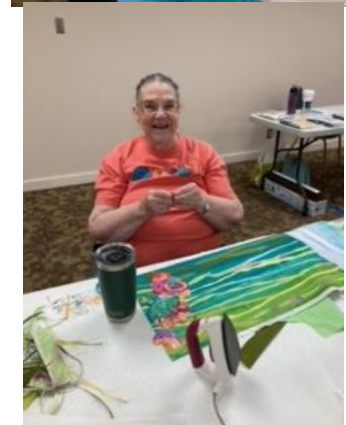
Workshop General Class information-

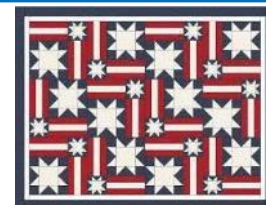
Hive News

Quilts of Valor



QGET Quilts of Valor group met and is pleased to announce we are going to be covering as many of our Tyler area veterans with quilts as we can possibly make and get awarded.

We currently have 3 veterans in our area ready to be awarded a QOV and we have those ready to go. Laura Giles is coordinating with these veterans to see when we can wrap them in their quilt.

Our group decided:

1. We will be making these quilts with patriotic donation fabric.
 - We welcome our Guild members to bring as much as they are willing to donate to our Guild meetings.
 - Fabric for backs would also be of great help.
2. We need longarm quilters who are willing to quilt these tops. We have 3 already signed up. Rhonda Chapman, Lucinda Cox and Susan Branscum.
3. We will meet quarterly beginning Jan. 9, 2023 at Pat Graham's home for a day of sewing, exchanging blocks, binding, cutting, selecting fabric, patterns, writing thank you notes, etc.
4. We will put together a block pattern with some fabric (kit) beginning in January to offer Guild members a chance to make some blocks.
5. We have purchased special QOV labels which also having washing instructions on them. They also list the name of person awarded to, date and location, pieced by, quilted by, and bound by.
6. We will try and make a pillowcase for each quilt which will also offer a clean way to carry them
7. We will try and locate more veterans in our area that have been touched by war and get them nominated to receive a QOV quilt. If you know of any contact Pat Graham and she can help you with the process of nominating them.
8. Working toward a deadline for a large groups of veterans to be awarded quilts at our July 13, 2023, Guild patriotic celebration program and lunch.

- 100% cotton fabric of good quality
- A QOV label
- A QGET label as well
- A pillow case to carry and store quilt in hopefully made from same quilt fabric
- A hand written thank you note which we have purchased for this purpose
- A Certificate of Appreciation with recipient's name on it
